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## **ABHW Welcomes White House Commission on Opioids**

WASHINGTON (March 30, 2017) – The Association for Behavioral Health and Wellness (ABHW), an association of the nation's leading behavioral health and wellness companies serving over 170 million people, today issued the following statement in response to a new White House Commission on Combatting Drug Addiction and the Opioid Crisis. The Commission will make recommendations to the President for improving Federal response to drug addiction and the opioid crisis.

“We are encouraged by the actions of the Administration in their effort to address this unprecedented opioid epidemic here in the United States. According to the Centers for Disease Control, nearly two million Americans struggle with opioid addiction which killed more than 33,000 people in 2015, more than any year on record. Death rates from opioid overdoses now exceed those from HIV/AIDS at the height of the epidemic in the 1990s.

“Much work has already been done to solve this crisis, yet more attention to this issue is needed. ABHW member companies employ a variety of approaches to help identify and treat individuals who have an opioid addiction. We support policies that will help individuals receive medically necessary, evidence based care that they need in order to recover and lead full and productive lives.

“We look forward to working with the Commission and the Administration on eradicating this epidemic that is killing almost 100 people each and every day.”
