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## ABHW RESPONDS TO THE APPROVED EXTENSION FOR COMMENTS FROM THE TRI-DEPARTMENTS ON MHPAEA

Washington, DC – The Association for Behavioral Health and Wellness (ABHW) welcomes the U.S. Department of Labor (DOL), the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), and the U.S. Department of Treasury (DOT), collectively, "the Tri-Departments'" approval on September 20<sup>th</sup>, of a 15-day extension of the comment periods for the Mental Health Parity and Addition Equity Act (MHPAEA) Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM) and Technical Release.

This extension signifies a crucial opportunity for stakeholders commenting on the NPRM to respond thoughtfully to the complex NPRM and more thoroughly answer the questions posed in the technical release.

Following the release of the MHPAEA proposed rules, ABHW led the sign-on <u>letter</u> effort to request this extension, and arranged a meeting with regulators to advocate for an extension.

As we advance comments from ABHW, we are committed to working with our member companies to provide recommendations to the Tri-Departments that enhance and refine the regulations governing mental health and substance use disorder parity.

This additional time gives all interested parties an opportunity to hone in on their recommendations to the Tri-Departments. Together, we can work towards strengthening MHPAEA and ensuring that those in need have equitable access to the care they require.
