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## The Association for Behavioral Health and Wellness Responds to Mental Health Parity and Addiction Equity Act Final Rule

Washington, D.C. — The Association for Behavioral Health and Wellness (ABHW), the national voice for payers that manage behavioral health insurance benefits for over 200 million people, issued the following statement in response to the U.S. Department of Labor (DOL), U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), and U.S. Department of Treasury's (collectively the "Tri-Department") final mental health and substance use disorder parity rule released today.

Since its inception, ABHW has been at the forefront of and an advocate for mental health and substance use disorder parity. ABHW was instrumental in drafting the legislation for the initial Mental Health Parity and Addiction Equity Act (MHPAEA) of 2008, and our members have worked tirelessly over the past 16 years to implement parity for behavioral health services.

ABHW appreciates that the Tri-Departments listened to stakeholders and in particular, did not adopt the proposed cumbersome mathematical tests to determine whether or not health plans were providing parity for nonquantitative treatment limits (NQTLs).

"We are concerned that provisions in the final rule, such as the material difference standard and meaningful benefits provisions, go beyond the law's intent and will create costly compliance hurdles that may negatively impact affordability and access to mental health and substance use disorder care," said ABHW President and CEO Pamela Greenberg.

We are currently evaluating the new NQTL parity requirements and the final rule's impact on health outcomes, quality, and cost of care.
